Key Takeaways from the Roundtable Include the Following:

- Lt. Gov Husted and Director Dackin shared the Governor is interested in issuing an Executive Order asking districts to utilize some sort of cell phone restrictions in schools. Husted stal
 Husted and Dackin reiterated any Administrative or Legislative action on cell phone use in schools would not mandate a universal ban. They acknowledge technology as tools in moder
 DEW stated they are working on a PR package for school districts that would accompany an Executive Order, with sample language for school board members, staff, parents, and the

Yesterday, Senator Brenner also added a mirror amendment to the Executive Order discussed at the roundtable into HB250, which in summary would: require schools and districts to adopt per schools. Senate Education Committee also added an amendment to HB250 that would fix the appropriate section of ORC so you all aren't penalized for using the grade band flexibilities p
