

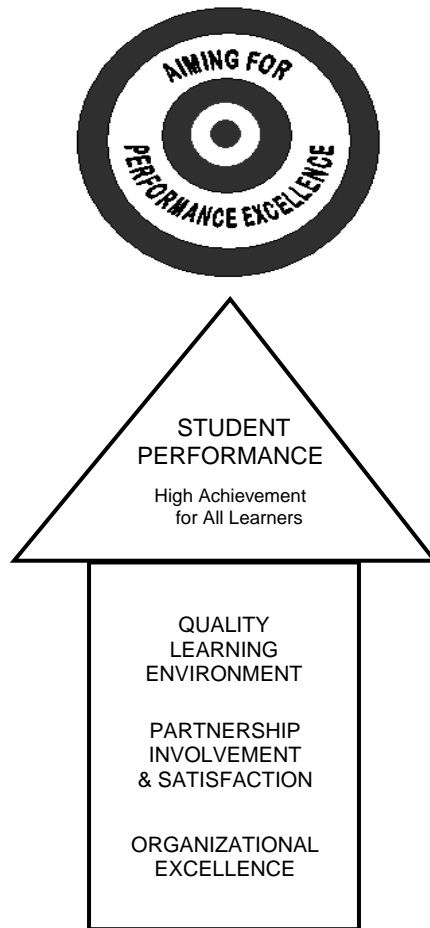

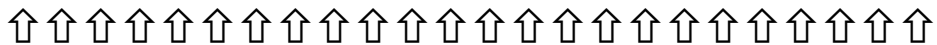

MAINTENANCE-CUSTODIAN

General Description of Essential Functions

1. The maintenance-custodian shall perform maintenance duties when not assigned as a substitute custodian.
 - a. The maintenance-custodian employee shall perform those duties assigned which will contribute to a high level of physical operation of Buckeye Local School District properties; and
 - b. *The maintenance duties may include maintenance of all small engine lawn equipment, heavy equipment, layout of athletic fields, and marking and general upkeep of athletic fields.***
2. When assigned as a substitute custodian, the maintenance-custodian shall perform the following duties.
 - a. Work cooperatively with the head custodian and building principal to insure a smooth operation of physical facilities;
 - b. Perform those duties designated involving the cleanliness, sanitation and maintenance of the buildings and grounds to which he/she is assigned, including such jobs as sweeping stairs, halls, classrooms and office areas, cleaning and servicing restrooms, washing walls, mopping halls and entranceways, minor electrical, mechanical and plumbing repairs, mowing of lawns, shoveling snow, and operation of the heating plant; and
 - c. Acquire a general knowledge of the building in which he/she is assigned, knowing the location of the main shut-off controls and valves of all utilities, fire alarm system, security alarm system and individual electrical control panels.
- ~~3. The maintenance custodian may be assigned a Tuesday through Saturday work schedule.~~

Specific Job Duties

The maintenance-custodian shall perform the following duties:

1. Perform ***all custodial or maintenance duties*** in a competent manner ~~these duties required of a custodian;~~
2. Learn the operating procedures and location of security systems in each building;
3. Be on the alert for minor repairs that may be necessary. Make such repairs as they are needed and as time permits;
4. Understand the heating plant and its operation in each building to which assigned;
5. Assist in remodeling, painting, repairing, snow removal and grounds care;

6. Assist in general maintenance of buildings and grounds, including minor plumbing, heating, electrical or carpentry repairs;
7. Maintain shrubbery and lawns with the use of manually operated and power equipment, tractors and mowers;
8. Perform general maintenance on large tractors and related equipment such as lawn mowers, front end loaders, etc.;
9. **Train summer maintenance workers on equipment use and maintenance;** and
10. Perform such other duties as may be assigned by the ~~Supervisor of Transportation/Maintenance~~ **director of operations.**

The maintenance-custodian shall possess the following qualifications:

1. Appropriate attire, well groomed, good personal hygiene;
2. High moral character;
3. Ability to assume responsibility and work cooperatively with others;
4. Physical characteristics, health and initiative to perform the required work, including successful completion of a board required physical examination by a board designated physician at board cost;
5. **Pass a pre-employment drug test for controlled substances and remain free of any alcohol or nonprescribed controlled substance abuse in the workplace throughout his/her employment in the district;**
6. Ability to lift a minimum of 60 ~~lbs.~~ **pounds** unassisted;
7. Demonstrate mechanical, electrical, plumbing and/or carpentry skills;
8. Ability to handle equipment such as diesel tractors, dump truck equipped with snow plow and trailers;
9. **Have knowledge of cleaning and operating paint spraying equipment;**
10. Have knowledge of oxygen/acetylene welding, **brazing, electric arc welding and cutting;**
11. Have knowledge of small gas engine repairs;

12. **Ability to read and interpret drawings and layout various athletic fields accurately;**
13. High school diploma or equivalent;
14. A good attendance record in previous places of employment;
15. Initiative and ability to work alone on projects without constant supervision;
16. **Hold a valid license for Ornamental Weed Control. This must be attained no later than 1 year from date of hire;** and
17. Hold a valid Ohio driver's license.
