Dear Mr. Notar:

The University of Colorado Boulder has approved the selection of Edgewood High School located in Ashtabula, Ohio to receive the Botvin LifeSkills Training (LST) High School Program grant.

A computer randomly assigned each participating school to one of two possible implementation timeframes – Fall 2021 (Cohort 1) or Fall 2023 (Cohort 2) – and your assignment is to implement in **Fall 2021 (Cohort 1)**.

What your school will receive for participating in this study: The LST High School program grant will provide training, technical assistance, curriculum materials, fidelity monitoring, and sustainability resources for a period of one year. In addition to programming and support, your school will receive \$100 per year for administering student assessments, for \$300 over the course of the study, and entered into multiple lottery drawings for \$1,000 - \$3,000 for completing the full study in Fall 2023. All schools will also receive school-aggregated data from their students' teen health behavior surveys.

In the coming weeks, your school will be assigned a University of Colorado Boulder Implementation Coordinator. At that time, we will be in contact to assist you with scheduling training dates, naming LST teachers and training participants, identifying a classroom observer, and begin planning for student survey administration in Fall 2021. Training dates and material needs must be requested at least 4-6 weeks in advance, and earlier submissions improve the likelihood of securing the requested dates. We will forward training requests to National Health Promotion Associates (NHPA), the organization responsible for conducting trainings, and will let you know as soon as your training dates are confirmed.

Thank you for your time and involvement in our initiative to implement and evaluate this evidence-informed health curriculum. Your school's and students' participation are so important for contributing critical evidence to understand this program's impact on youth health behaviors and well-being. What we discover from this study will help inform schools' decisions on which youth programs to invest in to reach their future goals.
